But we wanted to give more. And we wanted to reach an even younger audience. So we started brainstorming really concrete ways we can communicate and actively express love, acceptance, and inclusivity. Here are some of the prompts we used:

Remember a time when someone was a bridge for you. Remember a time when**you** were a bridge. Remember a time when you wanted to be a bridge but didn't know how. Looking back, what could you have done differently?

It took a LONG TIME—and one inspiring church sermon delivered by first-time preacher Alonso Moreno—for us to reflect and discover the text that appears in the book... but it was worth the struggle and worth the wait. We're grateful to Kirkus Reviews, who called it
