




Hello, Friends!



10. Book Trailer for D-39: A ROBODOG'S **JOURNEY**

How long has i-movie been sitting on my computer? I've used

it to make some very simple poem videos—my narration + one art image, like "Two Cows," inspired by Maud Lewis. But I wanted to make a book trailer, and I wanted to do it myself. That's what Klynt, the main (human) character in this middle-grade dystopian verse novel would do. And hello, kids who will be reading the book come May 18, 2021, can do it, so why not me? I was further encouraged after hearing from educators that ANY additional media is helpful in getting readers excited about reading.



So I wrote a script, and I asked (begged?) my dear friend Jim Reed to lend his glorious radio voice. (He said YES!) I scoured free video and photo sites for appropriate files (Pixabay is my favorite!). I tried out at least fifty free music tracks... and I did it! I made a one-minute book trailer! For FREE. All by myself! (Well, almost. Sweet son Eric added a little spit and polish at the end.)
